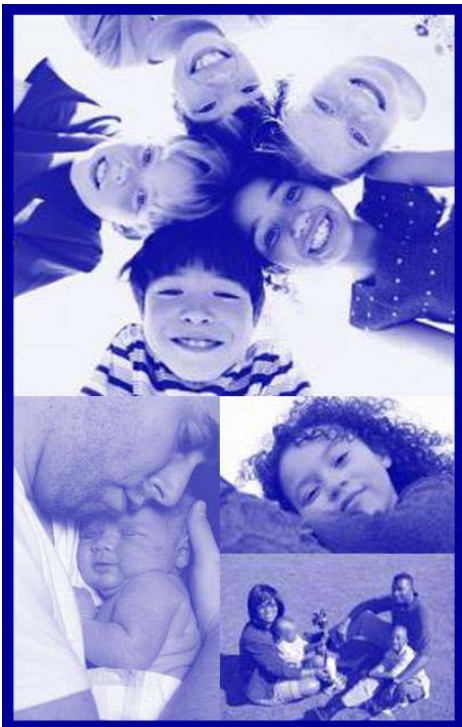
The HELPLINE Serves

- Community resources for emergency and financial assistance

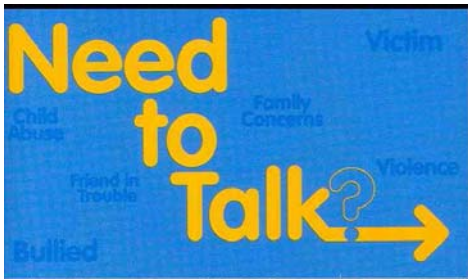
